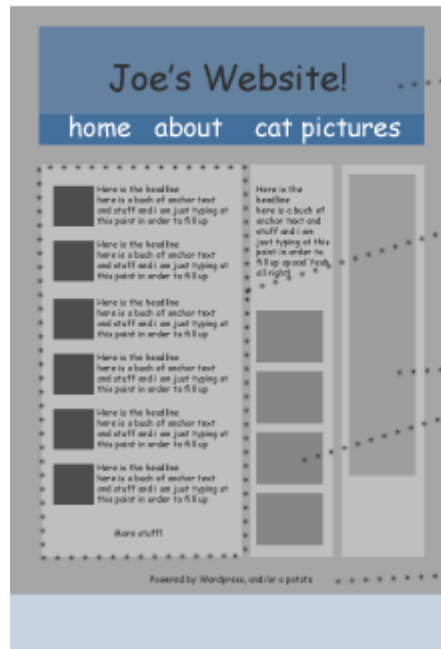


CHILD THEME: CHANGE LAYOUT/HTML

WHERE TO FIND WHAT?

- Style & layout: `style.css` (change via Appearance, Customize, Custom CSS)
- Change HTML/content/PHP:
 - [Anatomy of a WordPress theme](#)

To *change* a file, copy it from *parent* to *child theme* (theme folder). How to make a child theme was introduced in [session #3](#).



header.php

Global file that displays headers and navigation. Also contains HTML head code.

The Loop

The display of contents of the main area of your site are controlled by individual template files using what's called "the loop."

sidebar.php

Sidebar display is controlled in this file. Multiple sidebars can be set up in `functions.php`, and contents of sidebar widgets are set up from the WordPress wp-admin panel.

footer.php

Contains instructions for global footer and closes HTML tags.

Eg. to remove "Category:" or "Category Archives:" at the top of a category page



CHILD THEME: CHANGE LAYOUT/HTML

ADD FB LIKE BUTTON TO YOUR SITE

- If you did not do this yet: [create a child theme](#)
 - Get the code (e.g. [for a Like-button](#))
1. Find footer.php in parent theme, download it to your website folder
 2. Edit footer.php, insert the code, save
 3. Upload footer.php to child theme folder
